Each year Aquarion's Environmental Champion Awards honor volunteers working to protect and improve our beautiful state's environmental quality. On June 11, this year's winners took the stage at a special ceremony held at the Seacoast Science Center in Odiorne State Park.

The awards in this year's categories went to:

Apparel Impact (Business)

Among Apparel Impact's major environmental accomplishments are keeping over 10 million pounds of textiles from the waste stream, saving 5.3 billion gallons of water, providing clothing to over four thousand families, and educating young people about textile recycling.

Seabrook-Hamptons Estuary Alliance (SHEA) (Non-Profit)

SHEA was honored for years of work resulting in the protection of our state's coastal and aquatic resources through highly effective education, community outreach and focus on tough issues ranging from dune erosion to flooding adaptation.

For nearly 30 years, Joe has voluntarily dedicated his time and resources to the many successful programs of the Great Bay Stewards organization and Great Bay National Estuarine Research Reserve, including leading community outreach and a variety of education programs.

Margaret Maloney (Student)

Working at YMCA Camp Nokomis, Margaret has helped a myriad of campers learn the importance of conservation. Her tireless efforts have led the camp to install solar panels on its office building plus launch a comprehensive composting program.
