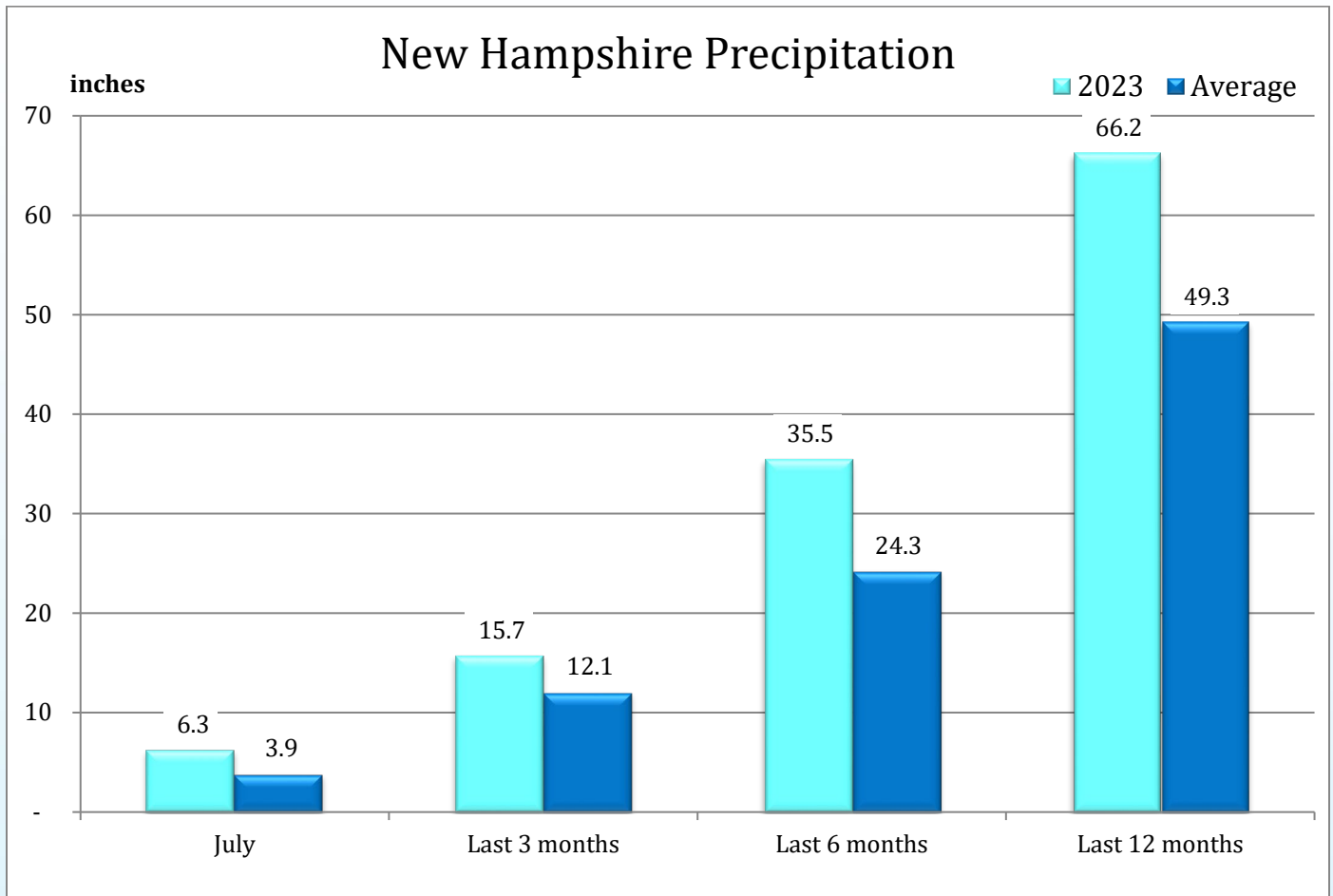


# Water Supply Update

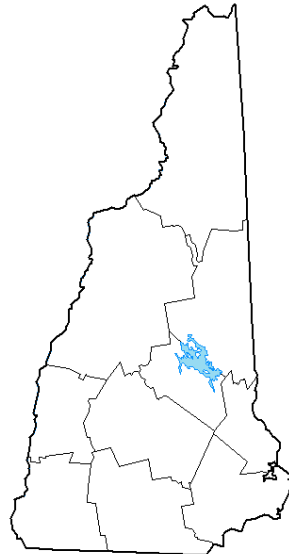
## Weather Trends/Outlook

Precipitation in July totaled 6.3 inches, much more than the long-term average of 3.9 inches. Higher than average precipitation over the past year has alleviated drought conditions. The U.S. Drought Monitor map shows no dry or drought conditions currently in any of Aquarion’s service areas.

Currently, there are no water use restrictions in place, yet customers are encouraged to follow these Best Practices for lawn watering. Following these practices will reduce the chance that water use restrictions may become necessary.

We recommend that customers water their lawns only two times per week. The optimum time to run sprinklers is between sunrise and 9 a.m., and one inch of water per week is sufficient to keep grass green.

Follow the twice-weekly sprinkler irrigation schedule

Avoid wasting water by sprinkling impermeable surfaces such as sidewalks and driveways.

No watering is necessary if it has rained within the last 48 hours. Pay attention the weather forecast and postpone watering if rain is forecast within the next 24 hours.

Hand watering is strongly encouraged for gardens, flowers and other ornamentals because it is a much more efficient use of water.
